## What is Woodward-Zambia?

**Woodward-Zambia Connection** is an international trip that offers a wealth of experiential learning in culture, education, resource conservation, and economics. This trip promotes our students' awareness of their place of privilege in the world as they visit schools and national parks in Zambia and interact with Zambian students and members of the local communities, as well as begin their experience in the cosmopolitan South African city of Cape Town.

Students will develop the specific skills of cross-cultural team building, language acquisition, survivalism, and problem solving in the beautiful landscape of Southern Africa.

## The Trip Has Three Components:

1. Field and Cultural Study in Cape Town
  - This first phase of the trip allow students to begin their adventure in the developed country of South Africa and appreciate the economic and geographical diversity of the continent. Students will tour the oldest township of Langa, visit the unique penguins of Boulders Beach, and hike from the Cape of Good Hope to Cape Point-- one of the farthest southern points on the African map.
2. Terranova in Mazabuka
  - The second and longest phase of the trip offers students the opportunity to invest in Woodward's decade-long relationship with the Terranova school and the surrounding community while living in a rustic safari camp. Students will spend their days interacting with Terranova students in conversation, tutorial, and sport.
3. Conservation Lower Zambezi (CLZ) in the Lower Zambezi National Park
  - The third phase of the trip offers students a unique view of this non-governmental organization's efforts to conserve wildlife, educate the community and fight poaching in the national park. Students will divide their time between community partnership projects (for example, the grainery building project) and guided game drives on the Zambezi River and in the park.

Students applying for this trip should expect and desire to have an authentic experience living as Zambians live. Portions of the trip will have students lodged in tents without direct access to power and running water. Students will be responsible for most of their own cooking. Woodward faculty chaperones will be on hand to teach and assist students with daily tasks, such as lighting fires and drawing water.

## Details for Woodward-Zambia Connection 2018:

- The trip will be in late June 2018/ early July 2018;
- The trip duration (including travel days) is 14 days;
- The cost for the trip is \$5000 and includes all international and domestic airfare, trip insurance, food in Cape Town, Terranova and CLZ, lodging at Cape Town, Lusaka, Terranova, and CLZ, and ground transportation;
- The ideal team size will be 10 students and 2 teacher chaperones;
- Students will range in grade from rising 11th graders through graduated 12th graders;
- All students travelling to Zambia are required to have a current passport and visa. The passport must be valid for at least six months after the intended date of departure from Zambia (July 2018). A single-entry visa may be obtained at the port of entry (Lusaka) for \$50 (cash only);
- Specific student immunizations and malaria prophylaxis will be recommended for travel to Southern Africa, but each family will be responsible for its own decision.
